A nominee must have had at least four years of education in STCQC, whether in the grade school, the high school, or the defunct college department.\*

She must have devoted at least five years to the field for which she is being cited.

She must be a woman of faith, service, and missionary spirit who:

 lives the Gospel values of justice, peace, truth, and love;

- promotes the concept of a transformative society; and
- maintains a vibrant relationship with God, people, and nature.

A nominee may come from any of the following fields of endeavor: culture and the arts, education, science and innovative technology, parish or community service, family life, and national development.
